RESTORING WREN'S HISTORIC CHURCH





St Andrew by the Wardrobe

This plans project to regenerate the historic Parish and Ward Church of St Andrew by the Wardrobe (by Sir Christopher Wren, Grade One listed) to allow the building also to be the new London Headquarters of the Egyptian **Coptic Orthodox Church. It will** flourish both as a centre for worship and for the support of the wider community and a place of sanctuary in the heart of the City of London as it reopens after the pandemic.

Twice before has the church been the subject of renewal: the medieval church was destroyed in the Great Fire of London, 1666 and rebuilt by Christopher Wren. Then in 1940 it was gutted in a bombing raid in the Second World War and re-opened in 1960.

This third regeneration, 2021, is led by The Venerable Luke Miller, Archdeacon of London and His Eminence, Archbishop Angaelos of the Egyptian Coptic Orthodox church in the Diocese of London. This partnership will provide an exemplar of Christian organisations working together in a model that furthers our shared faith whilst sustaining outstanding heritage buildings for the long-term.

Background & Significance

St Andrew has a strong significance as an integral part of London's history - the foundation of a church on the site dates from the time of William the Conqueror.


- Famous historic parishioners include William Shakespeare, John Dowland (lutenist and composer) and Sir Anthony van Dyke.
- Adjacent first to Baynard Castle (1138) and later to the King's Wardrobe (mid 14thC), hence its name.
- The existing church was built by Wren (1685 95) after the Great Fire destroyed the earlier church. After severe bomb damage in WW2, the interior was restored. Wren's walls and tower remain.

The Need

St Andrew by the Wardrobe is at a crossroads. It is well loved and valued by City organisations who fill it on significant occasions during the year, and it supports the work of the Archdeaconry of London across eighty-eight churches in the City and Westminster. Yet, with only a very small regular congregation, this intermittent activity is not enough to sustain it. St Andrew needs a new yearround use that will bring the church back to full life and provide an income to ensure its future viability. In order to secure the proposed partnership and achieve this outcome, significant investment is urgently needed. A recent report stated that the electrical system is failing and needs immediate renewal. Without this work the church will become unsafe and may have to close. In addition, the heating system is broken beyond economic repair, there are no accessible toilets and poor access for people with disabilities; the kitchens and existing toilets are in an unsatisfactory condition; the interiors, particularly the chapel and parish room, are unwelcoming. These problems need to be addressed if the church is to be once again a thriving centre for the wider population.

The Future

This proposed partnership is a splendid opportunity to bring a community back to the heart of the City. Future emphasis will be on building ecumenical ties, youth/community involvement, education and the support of the homeless and of refugees. The church will continue to be used for ceremonial occasions by our long-standing City partners and will welcome tourists, schools and local visitors.



The Cost

A schedule of works has been drawn up by Edwards Wilson and budgeted at **£900,000.** This includes a 7.5% contingency sum and an allowance for unreclaimable VAT. Both the Parish and the Coptic Orthodox Church are contributing to the cost and we have been promised a substantial grant from the City Churches Grants Committee. **It is urgent that we raise the full sum required before letting the contracts for the work and we are very grateful for any help that you are able to give us in any way.** To keep the church open, works on the electric and heating systems need to be carried out as soon as possible and we need to complete the fundraising so that works can begin.

Donors to date include: PCC of St Andrew by the Wardrobe; The Coptic Orthodox Diocese of London; The City Churches Grants Committee, The Castle Baynard Ward Club; The Worshipful Society of Apothecaries; The Worshipful Company of Blacksmiths.
